# Controversies in Percutaneous Nephrolithotomy (PCNL)

Margaret S. Pearle, MD - UT Southwestern Medical Center



Dr. Margaret Pearle is a Professor with joint appointments in UT Southwestern Medical Center's Department of Urology and the Mineral Metabolism Center, and is holder of the Ralph C. Smith Distinguished Chair in Urologic Education. She specializes in kidney stone treatment.

Dr. Pearle received her medical degree from the University of Chicago and completed her residency at Northwestern University Medical Center. She attended Washington University School of Medicine for her fellowship. She is a

Fellow of the American College of Surgeons, a Trustee of the American Board of Urology, a member of the American Association of Genitourinary Surgeons and the American Urological Association, and a member of the Board of Directors of the Endourological Society.

Her research interests include evaluation of dietary and medical therapies for kidney stone prevention, assessment of outcomes for minimally invasive surgical treatments, and development and assessment of resident teaching tools. She has published and spoken extensively on these topics.

## Social media and Urology

Stacy Loeb, MD - New York University (NYU)



Dr. Stacy Loeb is a Professor of Urology and Population Health at New York University (NYU) and the Manhattan Veterans Affairs Medical Center, specializing in prostate cancer. Dr. Loeb completed her urology residency training at Johns Hopkins and subsequently completed a Masters of Science in Comparative Effectiveness Research at New York University. She currently has grants from the Prostate Cancer Foundation, Department of Defense and NYU Perlmutter Cancer Center.

Dr. Loeb has published more than 350 peer-reviewed articles and 10 book chapters, primarily on prostate cancer, men's health, and social media. She is on the Editorial Board for the Journal of Clinical Oncology, European Urology, Reviews in Urology, Nature Reviews in Urology and Urology Times. She also authored the chapter on Early Detection, Diagnosis, and Staging of Prostate Cancer for Campbell-Walsh Urology, the primary textbook in the field.

Dr. Loeb received the 2021 Gold Cystoscope Award from the American Urological Association, which is awarded annually to a urologist for outstanding contributions to the field within 10 years of graduating from residency training. Dr. Loeb hosts the Men's Health Show on Sirius XM 110 US/Canadian satellite radio. Dr. Loeb is an active participant in social media, and has received multiple awards from the BJU International for her contributions to social media in medicine. Dr. Loeb is a member of the American Urological Association Public Media Committee and a consultant to the European Association of Urology Guidelines Office Social Media Committee.

## The Role of Penuma in Male Sexual Health

Michael P. O'Leary, MD - Brigham and Women's Hospital, Harvard Medical School



Dr. O'Leary is a senior urologic surgeon at Brigham and Women's Hospital and professor of surgery at Harvard Medical School. A graduate of George Washington Medical Center, he completed his residency in urology at Massachusetts General Hospital and New England Medical Center, and his fellowship at the University of California, San Francisco School of Medicine. He is board certified in urology. Dr. O'Leary has been identified as one of America's Top Urology Doctors by Castle Connolly and was named a top urologist by Boston Magazine.

An active researcher, Dr. O'Leary has focused on the development and validation of hard measures of subjective outcomes in urologic disease. He has been an investigator in clinical trials for new modalities of therapy for erectile dysfunction. Dr. O'Leary's current research includes benign prostatic hyperplasia (BPH) and male sexual dysfunction. His clinical specialties include: BPH, male infertility, male sexual dysfunction and stone disease.
